**Suggestions and Instructions to complete the Abstract Form

Abstract Rules: These are taken from the National and International rules and are excellent criteria for students, investigators and professionals.

Abstracts should contain:

- **Hypothesis** – The abstract clearly indicates the reason for conducting the research and the question being tested by the experiments performed.
- **Adequate Experimental Methods** – The investigators describe procedures used and/or include important or essential controls, so that the research can be replicated/evaluated by others.
- **Sufficient Data** – The investigators show the outcome(s) of their research and present sufficient data to support the authors' conclusion(s).
- **Summary of Essential Results** – The investigators concisely summarize the result(s) of their research.
- **Conclusion** – The investigators describe the conclusions of their research with regard to the hypothesis being tested.
- **No Duplicate Abstracts** – The abstract contents should not substantively overlap with that/those of an/other submitted abstract(s) by the same author or co-author(s).
- **No Promotional Content** – The abstract should not promote a specific product or procedure on behalf of a specific company or organization. However, an invited company may describe its procedures or services in a neutral, non-competitivel context.
- **Carefully Written Abstract** – Authors should use proper English language so that the abstract is comprehensible for scientists of different fields.

Key Submission Elements

The abstract should be submitted electronically via e-mail attachment to the SCBA Executive Director, instruction below. The submitting author should indicate if the abstract is for an oral presentation as an invited speaker or as an attendant for presentation in the Poster Session.

- **Title** - The title should clearly identify the contents of the abstract. Capitalize the first letter of each word except prepositions, articles, and species names. Italicize scientific names of organisms (e.g., *Candida albicans*)
- **Authors and Affiliations** - Each Author is entered separately. Each name is entered by completing fields for first (given), middle initial(s) and last (family) name. You should provide information on each author's institution/affiliation. **Do not give** department, division, branch, street address, etc. when completing the institution information.
- Enter the City and State/Province (if it is from the United States or Canada) and zip/postal code. If an author is from a country other than the United States, be sure to provide this information. Use abbreviations whenever possible. You will be able to designate the presenting author, add additional affiliations, and modify the order of the authors using the appropriate tools in the submission area. Please note that it is a General Meeting policy to list authors using all initials and last name. The submission system will insert affiliation superscripts and show the **presenting author in bold face type**.

- **Abstract Text** - Because of the large number of abstracts will be presented at the meeting, the text of each abstract should consist of no more than 1850 characters or about **250 words** (excluding spaces). **Do not include your title and author information as part of the abstract body**. The abstract text may be typed in any standard word processing program. Insert sub or superscripts, boldface, italics, or other required symbols as necessary. Tables, if presented, should be as simple as possible since they will be reduced in size in the final product to fit in a column approximately 2.5" (6.3 cm) in width. **Graphics** (graphs, pictures, etc.) **are not recommended** as (1) they are very difficult to properly size in the space available and (2) will be printed in black and white.
- **Files should be saved in Microsoft Word format (or rich text format).**
