


Dear Fellow SCBA Members,

2. SCBA International Symposium website



Notes from Editor-in-Chief of Cell & Bioscience

Dear SCBA Members,

Cell & Bioscience is the SCBA Society journal, which belongs to the SCBA members and the scientific community. As I reported in the last issue of the Newsletter, Cell & Bioscience has received an impact factor of 7.133 for 2020. Such increase in the impact standing has drawn substantial interests from the scientific community with a parallel increase in the number of submissions to the journal. We anticipate receiving submissions over 1,100 submissions this year. To sustain such rapid growth, we have implemented a more streamline editorial structure for efficient and effective evaluation of submissions to our journal. For our journal, all Editors work on a voluntary basis, devoting their expertise and time to the editorial processes. As I stated before, we need expertise in areas, which are currently lacking in our editorial portfolio, particularly expertise in cardiovascular disease, nephrology, structural biology, and other disciplines of bioscience. We welcome all experts in the above and other areas to volunteer as reviewers, Editorial Board members and Editors. Reviewers and Editorial Board members will serve at an ad hoc basis and will be called upon to evaluate the merits of submissions in their respective expertise. Editors will handle the review processes of submissions in his/her expertise and related fields; recruit appropriate reviewers from the journal reviewer database or to recruit new reviewers of his/her choice to assess the merits; and recommend a decision on the assigned submissions. To foster the growth of our Society journal, we need your contributions and inputs. Please contact me if you will be able to participate, recommend/nominate someone with the appropriate expertise to serve, or like to have more information on the editorial processes at: chris.lau@ucsf.edu.

I would also like to let you know that there are three special issues accepting invited and author-initiated submissions. The deadlines are approaching, so if you are interested, please contact the respective organizers regarding your potential submissions.

1. **Emerging Concepts in Neurodegenerative Diseases** - organized by Hui Zheng of Baylor College of Medicine and Lin Mei of Case Western Reserve University.
2. **Frontiers in Virology and COVID-19** - organized by Dong-Yan Jin of the University of Hong Kong, Zhi-Ming Zheng of the National Institutes of Health and Shan-Lu Liu of the Ohio State University.
3. **The Human Y Chromosome in Health and Disease** - Organized by Fadi Charchar of the Federation University of Australia, Chris Lau and Tatsuo Kido of the University of California San Francisco.

An Update from the Program Committee

Program Committee Updates of the 18th SCBA International Symposium, Boston, July 28 – 31, 2022

After a year of delay, the SCBA Biennial Symposium Program Committee resumed its monthly meeting on September 17. The Committee is co-chaired by Drs. Zhi-Ming Zheng (NIH) and Lee Zou (Harvard) and consists of additional nine members, including Drs. Hong Chen (Harvard), Genhong Cheng (UCLA), Xiang-Dong Fu (UCSD), Linheng Li (Stowers), Yang Liu (UMD), Lin Mei (Case Western), Qingchun Tong (UT Health), Dihua Yu ((UT MD Anderson), and Wenyi Wei (Harvard). The current SCBA President Dr. Hui Zheng and the SCBA President-Elect Dr. Shan-Lu Liu joined the meeting discussion. The committee meeting started with updating the conference venue status on the Tufts Joyce Cummings Center and surrounding hotels/on campus student dorms, discussed relevant topics, and made the following decisions:

1. The conference theme: **One World Health.**

2. The conference will have three invited keynotes, seven plenary talks, two awardee talks, 32 scientific, 4 non-scientific, and 3 poster sessions in three and a half day meeting.

A. Three confirmed keynote speakers are:

Dr. William Kaelin (2019 Nobel Laurate, Harvard University)

Dr. Harvey Alter (2020 Nobel Laurate, National Institutes of Health)

Dr. Feng Zhang (Massachusetts Institute of Technology)

Dr. Edward Chu (Albert Einstein University)

Dr. Kun-liang Guan (University of California, San Diego)

Dr. Zhigang He (Harvard University)

Dr. Pei-Yong Shi (University of Texas Medical Branch),

Dr. Yang Shi (Oxford University)

Dr. Hao Wu (Harvard University).

3. Ten scientific topics for workshop proposals have been decided with the assigned member/scientist (s) to lead each topic call (3-4 proposals per topic) as follows:

A. **SARS-COV-2 and Covid-19** (*Shan-Lu Liu*)

B. **Cancer biology and therapies** (*Dihua Yu/Wenyi Wei*)

C. **Neuroscience and neurodegenerative diseases** (*Lin Mei/Longjun Wu*)

D. **Pathogens and infections** (*Genhong Cheng/Zhi-Ming Zheng*)

E. **Immunity and immunotherapy** (*Yang Liu*)

F. **Genome integrity and DNA biology** (*Lee Zou*)

G. **Precision medicine, biotechnology & drug development** (*Hong Chen/Zhiqiang An*)

H. **RNA Biology** (*Xiang-Dong Fu*)

I. **Metabolism, stem cells, development & aging** (*Linheng Li/Qingchun Tong*)

J. **Plant biology** (*Xinnian Dong*)

2021 SCBA Award Announcement

SCBA has two awards that recognize the significant scientific contributions of one senior (The Presidential Award) and one young scientist (The Kenneth Fong Young Investigator Award), who are SCBA members, at the upcoming 18th SCBA International Symposium to be held in the Tuft Conference Center, Boston, Massachusetts on July 27 – 31, 2022. The Lifetime Achievement Award of SCBA may be presented to outstanding senior members. The nomination form for these awards is attached below. Both the Presidential and Young Investigator Awardees will deliver a plenary presentation at the 2022 SCBA International Symposium, in Boston, Massachusetts.

The SCBA Presidential Award is for a senior scientist whose cutting-edge scientific contribution in biosciences is globally recognized. His/her publications should be highly cited by his/her peers. He/she shall be regarded as a leader of his/her respective field of excellence.

The SCBA Kenneth Fong Young Investigator Award is for a young scientist who is recognized as a rising star in biosciences. The candidate's academic level should be at early or intermediate stages of independent career development in academia or biotechnology industry. The candidate's age must be 45 or younger in the year that the international symposium is held.

The SCBA Lifetime Achievement Award is for an outstanding senior scientist who is a recognized world leader with exceptional achievements in his/her field and has made significant contributions for a life-long career. The Lifetime Achievement Award is presented at irregular intervals, depending on the availability of qualified candidates.

SCBA is soliciting nominations of qualified candidates from any member for consideration for these awards, see attached detailed criteria. The candidates will be reviewed by the Award Committee. The deadline for nomination is January 31, 2022.

The Presidential Award is one of the highest honors of the Society for Chinese Bioscientists in America (SCBA) for scientists of Chinese descent in biomedical/bioscience fields. It is presented at regular intervals during each of the biennial SCBA Symposia to a qualified individual(s) who meets the criteria as outlined below.

Administration

1. The Award Committee of SCBA shall be the body responsible for the solicitation for nomination, evaluation, and selection of final candidate(s), based on the two-third-majority rule.
2. The Executive Council of SCBA shall be the final awarding body in deciding the award to the recommended candidate for the Presidential Award, based on the two-third-majority rule.
3. The Chair of the Award Committee or his/her designate, on behalf of the Executive Council, shall inform the selected recipient of the Presidential Award.
4. The Current President and President-Elect of SCBA, or their designates, shall be members of the Award Committee.

Nomination Process

1. A qualified candidate can be nominated by the signatures of a minimum of 10 members of good standing, former recipients of Lifetime Achievement Award and Presidential Award, or any member of the Award Committee.
2. The nominated candidate shall provide the Award Committee a comprehensive curriculum vitae.
3. The Award Committee, on behalf of the Executive Council, shall seek additional evaluation of the qualification of the nominee, in the forms of recommendation letters and/or evaluation critiques.

Award Selection Criteria

1. A candidate should possess exceptional achievements of groundbreaking and/or pioneering nature in his/her specialized biomedical/bioscience field(s).
2. A candidate should be recognized as a leader in his/her specialized field by his/her peers, as evidenced by being recipients of scientific honors and awards from established nonprofit organizations.
3. A candidate should have great influence on education through publications of his own research and his former students in the biomedical/bioscience fields.
4. A candidate must be a distinguished bioscientist of Chinese descent.
5. A candidate should not be a former recipient of the Lifetime Achievement or Young Investigator Award, except when his/her candidacy has been recommended and approved by two-third members of both the Award Committee and Executive Council of SCBA.
6. The Recipient of the Presidential Award shall receive his/her Award during the biennial SCBA Symposia, and at his/her discretion, present a scholarly lecture to the general membership.

The Young Investigator Award (formerly Junior Achievement Award) is a high honor of the Society for Chinese Bioscientists in America (SCBA) for a young scientist(s) of Chinese descent in biomedical/bioscience fields. It is presented at regular intervals during each of the biennial SCBA Symposia to a qualified individual(s) who meets the criteria as outlined below.

Administration

1. The Award Committee of SCBA shall be the body responsible for the solicitation for nomination, evaluation, and selection of final candidate(s), based on the two-third-majority rule.
2. The Executive Council of SCBA shall be the final awarding body in deciding the Award to the recommended candidate for the Young Investigator Award, based on the two-third-majority rule.
3. The Chair of the Award Committee or his/her designate, on behalf of the Executive Council, shall inform the selected recipient of the Young Investigator Award.
4. The Current President and President-Elect of SCBA, or their designates, shall be members of the Award Committee.

Nomination Process

1. A qualified candidate can be nominated by the signatures of a minimum of 5 members of good standing, former recipients of Lifetime Achievement, Presidential and Young Investigator Awards, or any member of the Award Committee.
2. The nominated candidate shall provide the Award Committee a comprehensive curriculum vitae.
3. The Award Committee, on behalf of the Executive Council, shall seek additional evaluation of the qualification of the nominee, in the forms of recommendation letters and/or evaluation critiques.

Award Selection Criteria

1. A candidate should be 45 years old or younger and at the early or intermediate stage of his/her scientific career in biomedical fields.
2. A candidate should possess exceptional achievements of groundbreaking and/or pioneering nature in his/her specialized biomedical/bioscience field(s).
3. A candidate should be recognized as a rising star in his/her specialized field by his/her peers, as evidenced by key publications of high impact peer-reviewed articles in meritorious scientific journals and/or being recipients of scientific honors and awards from established nonprofit organizations.
4. A candidate must be a bioscientist of Chinese descent.
5. The Recipient of the Young Investigator Award shall receive his/her Award during the biennial SCBA Symposium and present a scholarly lecture to the general membership.

The Lifetime Achievement Award is the highest honor of the Society for Chinese Bioscientists in America (SCBA) for scientists of Chinese descent in biomedical/bioscience fields. It is presented at irregular intervals depending on the availability of qualified candidates who meet the criteria as outlined below.

Administration

1. The Award Committee of SCBA shall be the body responsible for the solicitation for nomination, evaluation, and selection of final candidate(s), based on the two-third-majority rule.
2. The Executive Council of SCBA shall be the final awarding body in deciding the Award to the recommended candidate for the Young Investigator Award, based on the two-third-majority rule.
3. The Chair of the Award Committee or his/her designate, on behalf of the Executive Council, shall inform the selected recipient of the Young Investigator Award.
4. The Current President and President-Elect of SCBA, or their designates, shall be members of the Award Committee.

Nomination Process

1. A qualified candidate can be nominated by the signatures of a minimum of 25 members of good standing, former recipients of Lifetime Achievement and Presidential or majority membership of the Award Committee.
2. The nominated candidate shall provide the Award Committee a comprehensive curriculum vitae.
3. The Award Committee, on behalf of the Executive Council, shall seek additional evaluation of the qualification of the nominee, in the forms of recommendation letters and/or evaluation critiques.

Award Selection Criteria

1. A candidate should be at least 62 years old and at or near the end of his/her successful scientific career in biomedical fields.
2. A candidate should possess exceptional achievements of groundbreaking and/or pioneering nature in his/her specialized biomedical/bioscience field(s).
3. A candidate should be recognized as a leader in his/her specialized field by his/her peers, as evidenced by being recipients of scientific honors and awards from established nonprofit organizations.
4. A candidate should have great influence on education through publications of his/her own research and his/her former students in the biomedical/bioscience fields.
5. A candidate must be a distinguished bioscientist of Chinese descent.
6. A candidate should not be a former recipient of the Presidential Award, except when his/her candidacy has been recommended and approved by two-third members of both the Award Committee and Executive Council of SCBA.
7. The Recipient of the Lifetime Achievement Award shall receive his/her Award during the biennial SCBA Symposia, and at his/her discretion, present a scholarly lecture to the general membership.


